RULE OF LAW: THE AMBIGUITIES OF AN UNQUALIFIED HUMAN GOOD

This talk discusses the potential and limits of the rule of law in constitutional self-defense. As a conceptual tool, 'rule of law' is ubiquitous, wielded by many including those not committed to the capacity of constitutionalism to impose restraints on unchecked power. In a narrow reading, the rule of law not only does not halt, but may even perpetuate ruler domination. But when recognizing this inherent limitation, it may serve as a powerful response to illiberal practices of cheating.
